El Moutawakel's achievement made her the first woman in an Islamic nation to win an Olympic medal and the first Moroccan athlete of both sexes to win a gold medal.

LEBRON JAMES



Lebron James, a true legend

LeBron Raymone James is an American basketball player who currently belongs to the Los Angeles Lakers NBA team. He told me that he was 2.06 meters tall and also that his position is forward, but they told LeBron that due to his talent, versatility and physical power they allow him to play both at the base and in forward power. James told me that he is considered one of the best basketball players in the world and in history.

How long have you been playing basketball?

since I was very small although I debuted at only 18 years old

Why did you start?

I started on the courts in my neighborhood and my body was made for this sport and I grew up from there

Where did you usuall play basketball?

I started in the Cleveland Cavaliers and currently play in the Los Angeles Lakers

How often do you train?

we train every day of the week except weekends

What was your first record in the NBA?

I was the first player in NBA history to score 2,000 points, 500 rebounds, and 500 assists in seven seasons.

KOBE BRYANT

Kobe Bean Bryant born in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania on August 23, 1978 in Calabasas, California was an American basketball player who played twenty seasons in the NBA, all of them in Los Angeles Lakers, from 1996 to 2016.

Died on January 26, 2020

In the 1996 NBA draft, Charlotte Hornets selected him in thirteenth position. Then-Lakers general manager Jerry West had witnessed Kobe's basketball potential and abilities on pre-draft campuses. Immediately after the draft, Bryant expressed through his agent his wish not to play for the Hornets.

Fifteen days later, West transferred his starting center Vlade Divac to the Hornets for young Bryant.

In his second season, he became the youngest player to play an All-Star Game, with a record of 18 points and 6 rebounds. He began to play more minutes and have more importance in the team, although he had not yet established himself as a starter in the Lakers, as he was surpassed by Nick Van Exel and Eddie Jones

On December 18, 2017, he wrote for The Players' Tribune, when he announced his withdrawal. Bryant died on January 26, 2020 at the age of 41 in a helicopter accident among those affected by his 13-year-old daughter Gianna Maria. On April 4, 2020, he was elected posthumously, to join the 2020 class of the Basketball Hall of Fame.
